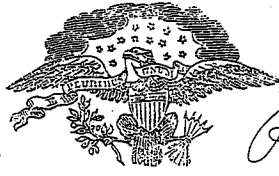

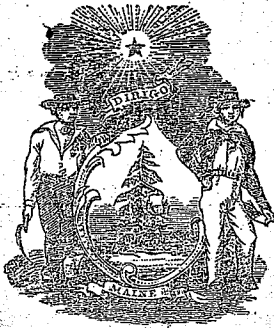

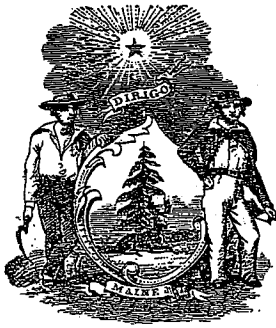

GENERAL ORDER NO. 26.

I. It is desirable to obtain all the re-enlistments possible of three years men having less than a year to serve, in order to secure to the respective commands the privilege of remaining in service as veteran regiments and corps, and to this end the influence and effort of all officers in service is solicited.

II. The opportunity now afforded to each veteran soldier for securing the munificent bounties offered for his re-enlistment may never again be presented, and the time given for making such re-enlistments will soon expire. Each man re-enlisting receives a sum sufficient to lay the foundation for independence, and place him beyond the reach of want. In addition to the government bounty of \$402 to each veteran volunteer, the State will pay a bounty of \$100, and towns a further sum of \$200, making a total amount of \$702.

III. On re-enlisting the soldier will be entitled to a furlough of at least thirty days, with transportation home and back. During his visit home he will be paid his State and town bounties.

IV. Re-enlistments will be credited to the quotas of the several cities, towns and plantations of the soldier's residence, and these corporations will pay the \$200 town bounty, unless their quotas have been previously filled. If so, or if this amount of bounty is not promptly paid him therefrom, he will be assigned to some place deficient upon its quota paying this bounty.

V. Re-enlisting soldiers of Maine Regiments and Corps having no place of residence in this State, will be assigned to the quotas of places deficient paying the bounty named.

VI. Any bounties or other money which soldiers may desire to deposit, will be received by the Treasurer of State, and held subject to the order of said volunteer, and will draw interest at the rate of five per centum per annum.

VII. The re-enlistment papers should be taken in triplicate, instead of duplicate, as is understood to be the practice, in order that one part of the enlistment contract may be filed with the records of this office, which is required for all enlistments made in this State.

VIII. If re-enlistments have already been made and taken only in duplicate, a certified copy of same, specifying residence, with certificate of muster-in, will be sent to this office, and will be considered as answering for such re-enlistments the same purpose as a part of the original contract.

IX. As sufficient blank enlistment papers may not be obtained through the regular sources, for making the triplicate of enlistment required under the provisions of this order for this office, and if obtained the usual form is deficient in particulars required for record here, as it does not specify "residence," "married or single," &c., blanks of proper form, containing additional spaces for the statement of these facts, are this day forwarded to your direction by mail or express, which blanks will always be used for the return to this office.

X. The papers will be transmitted to this office through Regimental Headquarters, or by the duly authorized Recruiting Officer for the regiment making the re-enlistments.

XI. The receipt of this order and the blanks transmitted will be acknowledged, and information furnished of the feeling and prospect for making re-enlistments in the respective regiments and corps. Copies of this order are sent for each company of the several commands.
