

Company D Standing Orders

1. Sharpshooters and their families have fun reliving the past.
2. Sharpshooters support, encourage, communicate, and educate each other.
3. Sharpshooters practice the highest levels of safety on and off the field.
4. Sharpshooters have the cleanest, most orderly camps.
5. Sharpshooters are the best drilled, most highly trained soldiers.
6. Sharpshooters work with the public and participate in demonstrations.
7. Sharpshooters share ideas and concerns for the good of the company.
8. Sharpshooters are always on time and ready for duty and ready to fight.
 - Every Sharpshooter that plans to take the field MUST be at morning parade ON TIME prior to first battle.
 - Failure to be at drill and/or parade will result in being held back from taking the field for the 1st battle
9. Sharpshooters fall in for roll call following reveille.
 - All Sharpshooters are to be in camp and online for morning roll/sick call right after reveille at 6 a.m.
10. Sharpshooters sick or wounded inform the 1st Sgt.
11. Sharpshooters leaving camp apply for a pass from the commanding officer.
 - If leaving camp, notify company commander or first sergeant. Give reason for leaving (sutlers, civilian camp etc.).
 - When leaving camp, the coat or vest, waist belt, cap/hat, and canteens will be taken.
12. Sharpshooters drill thoroughly and comprehensively for one hour every day.
13. Sharpshooters attend parade in order to battle the enemy.
14. Sharpshooters stay hydrated at all times.
 - Hydration is the primary concern. One canteen shall be consumed each battle and between battles.
15. Sharpshooters always guard their weapons and ammunition.
 - Absolutely no weapons or ammunition will be left unattended at any time. Should a weapon or ammunition be left unattended the company commander or NCO will immediately notified.
16. Sharpshooters follow all military and civilian protocols and courtesies.
 - All sharpshooters shall give proper courtesies to all NCO's and officers. Officers shall receive the proper salute (hand, while armed ect.) and addressed by rank and name or simply by rank. NCO's will be addressed by rank and name or simply by rank but not saluted. When any officer enters camp, anyone may call "officer in camp!" Everyone is to stand at attention and the ranking officer will salute if properly dressed and await to have the officer pass or salute returned.
 - Do not walk across, down or through another company street. If wanting to or needed to enter another company street. Wait at the bottom and request permission to enter the street.
 - Coats and vests may and may not be worn while in military camp, While in civilian camp either the coat or vest must be worn. While under a fly, the cap/hat will not be worn.
17. Sharpshooters thoroughly clean and properly care for their rifles before 6 p.m.
18. Sharpshooters have the most accurate historical impressions.
19. Sharpshooters introduce and escort visiting civilian ladies in and out of camp for short visits.
 - If a lady or ladies wish to enter camp, permission must be asked. "Ms./Mrs. _____ requests to enter camp" and she must be escorted. With permission given, "lady in camp" will be called and time given for men to put on vests or coats. Once done the lady or ladies may be escorted into camp.
 - No lady/ladies shall remain in camp for a prolonged period of time. They must conduct their task in camp and leave soon after. No improper fraternization will take place while in military camp during public hours with any rank.
20. Sharpshooters respect Tattoo and Taps
 - All non-sharpshooter minors are to be out of military camp by 10:00 p.m.
